## SAY THANKS! IT'S A JEWISH THING TO DO

If a Jew breaks a leg, he thanks God he did not break both legs; If he breaks both, he thanks God he did not break his neck. – Yiddish Proverb

From the time we were little children, our parents have demanded that we live life with a sense of gratitude for the world. After receiving a toy or piece of candy we were prodded with these words: "What do you say?" Without hesitation, we learned to respond, "Thank You!" Appreciation and thankfulness are as much a part of the maturing process as any other human value. As Jews, we are taught to extend this thanks to God as we experience the many blessings of life. Our worship service includes prayers of thanks every day.

One of the earliest advocates of a daily gratitude practice was the Dutch philosopher Baruch Spinoza. In the 17th Century he suggested that each day for a month, we should ask ourselves the following three questions:

Who or what inspired me today?

What brought me happiness today?

What brought me comfort and deep peace today?

This practice, wrote Spinoza, would help us find more meaning and joy in our lives and would lead to profound transformation.

What if we were to engage in this practice for even one week? As we approach Thanksgiving, it is a perfect opportunity to synchronize this Jewish teaching with our secular life. We invite you to spend the week prior to the holiday becoming more aware of your blessings. Then, join us as we share our thanks with the world. We believe that the more we give thanks, the more we will find joy in the world.
